Curriculum for the Course for Highly Gifted Students INSTRUMENTAL STUDIES

at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz

Preamble

The Austrian University Act (2002) and the statutes of the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz (KUG) form the legal basis of the university training course. The curriculum decided by the Curricular Committee on 8 May 2019 and approved by the Senate on 18 June 2019 came into force on 1 October 2019.

Qualification profile

The Course for Highly Gifted Students in Instrumental Studies comprehensively develops the required musical and artistic skills in highly gifted children and adolescents, and the technical abilities on the relevant instrument with the aim of being able to complete a regular degree programme.

Choice of instruments

Accordion, Bass Tuba, Bassoon, Flute, Guitar, Harp, French Horn, Clarinet, Piano, Double Bass, Oboe, Organ, Trombone, Saxophone, Percussion, Trumpet, Viola, Violin, Cello

Admission

Exceptional musical talent and physical aptitude for the chosen instrument are prerequisites for admission to the course for highly gifted students. These prerequisites must be verified in an admission examination.

An examination committee, appointed by the Dean of Studies, makes the decision regarding admission.

There is no lower age limit for admission to the Course for Highly Gifted Students. Students can participate in the Course for Highly Gifted Students up to the age of 18 (i.e. must be 18 or below on 30 September).

For students who are older than 15 years, the maximum duration of this course is two semesters. Following successful completion of the admission examination, students will be admitted as non-degree programme students.

End of year examination

The major artistic subject must be graded by the teacher at the end of the winter semester, and an examination in front of a committee must be taken at the end of the summer semester. The Vice Rector for Academic Affairs will appoint the examination committee for the examination in front of a committee. If the student starts the course in a summer semester, the first examination in front of a committee will take place at the end of the second summer semester.

Course fee per semester

Course fee €600

Participation is subject to payment of the course fee and the fees set by the Austrian National Union of Students.
