Curriculum for the Postgraduate University Course ADVANCED STUDIES – INSTRUMENTAL (Post-Master's Programme)

at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz

Preamble

The Austrian University Act (2002) (UG) and the statutes of the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz form the legal basis of the postgraduate university course. The curriculum decided by the Curricular Committee on 8 May 2019 and approved by the Senate on 18 June 2019 came into force on 1 October 2019.

Qualification profile

The Postgraduate University Course Advanced Studies – Instrumental (Post-Master's Programme) builds on the abilities acquired by students in the master's programme. It extends both the musical and interpretational skills, they will need as professional musicians and their technical abilities on the respective instrument. In particular, the further deepening of relevant musical knowledge, practical implementation of this knowledge in solo, chamber and orchestral repertoire, and consideration of artistic and reflective musical aspects, enable musicians to become universally, practically qualified and expand their career options.

Choice of instruments

- Accordion, Bass Tuba, Bassoon, Flute, Guitar, Harp, French Horn, Clarinet, Piano, Double Bass, Oboe, Organ, Trombone, Saxophone, Percussion, Trumpet, Viola, Violin, Cello
- Instrumental Coaching
- Chamber Music for Guitar (as a fixed ensemble only)
- Chamber Music for Strings and Piano (as a fixed ensemble of three or more instruments only)
- Piano Duo (as a fixed duo only)
- Piano Vocal Accompaniment

Admission

A completed diploma or master's (or equivalent degree) programme in the relevant major artistic subject at a postsecondary educational institution in Austria or abroad is a prerequisite for registering for the admission examination. Applicants must submit a relevant degree certificate. Certificates in a language other than German or English must include a certified translation.

An examination board, appointed by the Dean of Studies, makes the decision regarding admission. For the admission examination, a programme consisting of three works from different stylistic periods, equivalent to a difficulty level to that for a master's degree examination (see Instrumental Studies curriculum) must be prepared.

After successful completion of the admission examination, students will be admitted as non-degree programme students.

Duration

The duration of this course is two semesters.

Students may repeat the course once (including the electives) with the prior agreement of the head of the major artistic subject and the approval of the Vice Rector for Academic Affairs.
